The scholarship will be awarded to a student who is well rounded and upholds the virtues of St. Pius X. He/she must have good grades, as well as, participate in sports and/or extracurricular activities. The applicant must also give service to the community, and be a friend and mentor to St. Pius X students.....who appreciates and values his/her beloved Alma Mater, “St. Pius X School.”

This scholarship will be awarded yearly to a rising 5<sup>th</sup> through 8th grade student at the *Honors Convocation* dinner hosted by St. Pius X Catholic School. Students are asked to describe, in written form, why they merit being awarded The Cayce Castelow Scholarship. The written applications will be submitted to and reviewed by the St. Pius X Administration and a faculty designee. All approved applications will then be given to the Castelow family who will make the final decision to the winner(s) of the scholarship.

One (1) \$1000 scholarship will be awarded each year to a deserving student for the period of one academic year. The scholarship award is not renewable; however the recipient is able to apply for the scholarship award each subsequent year, through 8<sup>th</sup> grade.
